**4. REPORT FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL**

- It has been a privilege and an honour to serve as Chairman this year and have very much enjoyed representing the residents of West End. Our village has a rich variety of local groups and activities that enhance our wellbeing and promote a sense of cohesive community which the Parish Council works so hard to promote and protect.
- Successful events held in the last year include: Summer Tea Dance; Senior Citizen's Christmas Party; Children's Panto; Turning on the Lights and the Community Games. The Parish Council aim to provide events that cover the spectrum of ages, with hopefully, something for everyone. We also continue to support the Carnival Committee and gave thanks to the Chair, Rick MacDonald and the Carnival Committee for their commitment.
- Gave thanks to Rev Thomas Wharton and St James Church for their help with Remembrance Day and also to Hildene Centre for hosting.
- Hosted St James School for the raising of the Commonwealth flag, with a quiz provided for the children.
- Refurbishment of the Moorgreen Recreation Ground tennis courts were carried out this year – details of booking the court can be found on the website.
- New public toilets opened in March 2018 which are located in the Parish Centre car park to allow for easy access. The old public toilets were on land not owned by the Parish Council, hence the relocation. Gave thanks to HEWEB Local Area Committee for allocating developer's contributions to the project.
- Substantial tree works have been carried out including pollarding of the Lime trees on Hatch grange.
- The Main Hall at the Parish Centre was refurbished last summer to make it brighter and more modern to be able to cater for a fuller range of events.
- The Hatch Café continues to prove successful. Several new members of staff have joined this year, with Jo supervising the team. The Parish Council will be working hard to enhance this facility over the coming years.
- Ensured West End's voice was heard on many planning inquiries and local plan meetings. The Parish Council contributed to the success of winning the second inquiry into land at Bubb Lane and to ensure that Borough Councillors heard from West End on the proposed option of 'Allington' being a major site in the draft Local Plan. Public consultation is planned for later this year and it is really important that residents express their views. Residents will be advised of the timetable over the coming months.
- Continue to raise the profile of traffic and parking problems in West End. Hosted a meeting for Midlands Estate residents and also Ivy Lane residents. Currently awaiting the results of a parking study to see if any solutions can be suggested.
- Continue to maintain range of buildings provided for community use and improve the facilities. The Youthhouse continues to grow under the leadership of Nikki with the help of Hannah and the youth team. Gave thanks for all their hard work and dedication.
- Gave thanks to: Laura Cooke for successfully leading all staff to provide a high level of customer service; Parish Office staff who deal with a wide range of issues; Nikki Penny and the Youth Team for delivering an excellent service to young people in West End; Steve Adams and the groundstaff for keeping up an excellent standard in the community; caretaking staff and Hatch Café staff.
- Gave thanks to Friends of Hatch Grange and Friends of Chartwell Copse for all their efforts, along with volunteers who help to maintain these areas.
- Gave thanks to fellow Councillors with special thanks to Councillors Asman, Clarke, Davis, Boulton and Goguel who helped resolve a very sensitive matter and to Councillors MacDonald, Craig, Smith, Hellier and Tennent for their cooperation and support.

- Gareth Bates and Peter Brown resigned last year and Councillor Anne Mortimer will be saying farewell in May as a result of significant health issues. Anne has been a committed, passionate advocate for West End and is very well respected by her peers and residents alike. Anne's professional experience and advice over the years has been much appreciated and the Council has created a reward to honour a resident who gives up time to volunteer to enhance our community. This award will be given to Anne this year and will continue for future years as the 'Anne Mortimer Award'. Unfortunately Anne was not able to attend this evening due to ill health, so her presentation will take place at another time.

#### **6. REPORT FROM HAMPSHIRE POLICE REPRESENTATIVE – Police Sergeant Cat Manns**

- My aim as the Sergeant responsible for your Neighbourhood Policing Team is to provide you with an overview of the current crime figures, highlight any trends or patterns, seek feedback and your views in relation to the report, and then set/update our community priorities based on all of the information we already have (seasonal trends / previous priorities / district problems / county wide problems etc).
- Your Neighbourhood Team consists of myself as the Sergeant, PC Jason Steel as the PC and PCSOs Mica Coppin and Emma Heaton.
- You may or may not be aware that Hedge End is still a fully operational police station with officers working from here 24/7 despite the fact that it is closed to members of the public (no 'front office' service). The response teams that cover Eastleigh and Test Valley South run from Hedge End as well as the Hedge End North and South teams. I mention this because I want to make you aware that from May 15<sup>th</sup> for approximately 4 -6 months a complete refurbishment is taking place. During that time we will be operating from Eastleigh Police Station.
- Total crime is down year on year for Jan/Feb/March mainly due to the decrease in violence against the person offences. This year we have been focusing on targeting some domestic violence offenders.
- Increase in criminal damage incidents – partner agencies are to address youth ASB issues as an ongoing workstream. Also a rise in offensive weapons – all parties visited by Police and issued warning letters.
- Anti-social Behaviour – considerable work around youth ASB and vehicle ASB such as engaging with programmes offering a service and utilising partners such as Youth Options and Street Pastors. PCSOs have conducted home visits as well as referrals to youth Crime Prevention and the Youth Offending Team. Working with Roads Policing Unit with regard to vehicle ASB.
- Three levels of policing priorities:
  - i) Force Priorities – overarching themes which all teams are expected to contribute to
  - ii) District Priorities – things specifically impacting on Eastleigh. Three main areas affecting Eastleigh District include: Violent Crime; Burglary and Theft from Motor Vehicles
  - iii) Community Priorities – based on feedback from public. For this period community priorities have been set to: Burglary; Vehicle ASB; Theft from Motor Vehicles.

- Beat Surgeries continue at Asda and Cops n Chat at the Parish Centre.

#### **REPORT FROM PCSO MICA COPPIN**

- Attended Youth Club Community Games last year - organised a rounders match and set up a stand giving crime advice to residents.
- Attended West End Carnival - engaged with children and adults. Promoted Hampshire Alerts.
- Cops n Chat – very rarely attended.
- Asda Drop In – a better response due to general public using store.
- Behind the scenes work – safeguarding and working with families.

The Chair thanked the police for their engagement with the community and said it was very much appreciated.

A member of the public thanked the police for their support in running The Hub in Hedge End. She said parents were very appreciative of the work carried out by the police at this venue as it helped young people who find it difficult to adapt in the community.

### **7. REPORT FROM ORGANISATIONS WITHIN WEST END PARISH**

#### **St James' Church – Steve Wiseman**

- Continue to enjoy strong links with St James' C of E Primary School and following a recent intergenerational project, which brought together older people from church and young people from school, there is now a regular knitting club running.
- Completed the 'Warm Welcome Project' and now have a modern kitchen and refurbished hall to better cater for local community groups. This was made possible by grants received including the Biffa Award and Veolia.
- Received great support at the West End Remembrance Service and Parade, especially from uniformed groups and look forward to an exciting initiative between the school and church to mark the centenary celebrations of World War 1 this November.
- Christmas Tree Festival will be held again this year. All welcome to partake.

#### **MENCAP – Pauline Spiers**

- Flagship Art Club is well attended – currently 10 adults with learning disabilities in the Eastleigh area.
- Annual exhibition held in November and sales of work were made. Another exhibition will take place this year around October/November.
- Highlight this year was entering the One Community Christmas Tree Festival – a tree was made out of paper using various art techniques – good publicity for the organisation.
- Will be attending West End Carnival again this year and art club members will be making their own costumes. Have been given funds to run a Carnival Project involving 5 training workshops with a professional carnival organiser. Sessions to be held at Hilldene Community Centre from 10<sup>th</sup> May to 14<sup>th</sup> June on a Thursday. Cost is £5 per session.

#### **West End Youth Club – Mrs Nikki Penny, Youth Leader**

- Members have increased over the last year. – 300 more young people mostly from the new Chartwell Youth Club. Two weekly sessions now running at Chartwell.

- Fundraising amounted to £2241.50 over the last year. This was achieved from cricket parking and the sale of wooden reindeers. Funds were used to install a new kitchen at the Youth Centre.
- Chartwell Youth Centre will be running an afternoon session for confidential drop in. Membership is up to 20 young people per session at this centre.

#### **Hatch Grange WI – Mrs Maureen Cook**

- Meet on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month. Activities include: speakers; entertainment; outings. Extra groups available include: craft; darts; Scrabble; poetry; badminton and more.
- Celebrating 50 years in West End in 2020 and the Hampshire WI is 100 years old this year. To celebrate this there are many activities going on, the first being the WI Festival in Eastleigh on Sunday, 13<sup>th</sup> May – 11am to 4pm.
- There is no waiting list this year so anyone interested please contact me.

#### **Friends of Hatch Grange – Cllr Rick MacDonald**

- April Work Day – worked on paths at Megan Green and end of the Hatch.
- NICE in Hedge End returned in May last year finishing off paths, as part of their Companies Global Community Months. They have been in contact again for this year.
- Numbers for Work Mornings have dropped – will be re-starting for this year and promoting via Facebook. We have reverted to a Wednesday Workday.
- Mid-May, our local grazier placed young cows in the fields. Unfortunately they had to be removed after being attacked by dogs. Following veterinary care, the cows were ok and the owners of the dogs were reported to the police. Three cows were put back in the meadows in July with signage displayed.
- Involved with the Carnival with our Secretary leading the procession and members marshalling the road closures.
- Conservation volunteers carried out work in the pond and also producing a flyer for us to help promote FoHG.
- October Work Day – work carried out in the Copse and bottom field.
- Successful Skittles Evening at Halloween. To be repeated this year.
- Vice Chair laid the FoHG wreath on Remembrance Day.
- Snow led to many children and adults sledging down the hill in the Hatch. Disappointed with the amount of broken plastic sledges left lying around.
- Next Work Day to be held 12<sup>th</sup> May – work to be carried out to clear the stream and scrub between Megan Green and The Hatch.

#### **West End Garden & Allotment Association – Mrs Joy Clements**

- Our main area of operation is the sale of garden sundries from our trading hut at the Moorgreen Allotment site. The small profits we make from this are ploughed back into various events we run for members.
- Membership is £2.00 per annum and is open to gardeners as well as allotment holders. Less than 50% of our members have allotments in West End. We are open most Saturdays and Sundays between 10am and 12 noon. Our sales include seeds, compost fertilisers and manures and a lot more.
- We hold a flower, fruit and vegetable show on the first Sunday in August and all are welcome to enter their produce between 10am and 11.30am on the day. Viewing of the exhibits is open after 2pm.
- Majority of our allotment holders have been tending their plots for decades and some are in the 70's and 80's. We are beginning to see some new and enthusiastic younger members joining us.
- Thanked West End Parish Council for their support in the last 12 months.

**West End Carnival Association – Cllr Rick MacDonald**

- Last year's Carnival was very well attended, with 22 entrants in the procession.
- Thanked local businesses, volunteer groups, general public, Parish staff and the carnival Committee for all their support.
- This year's Carnival will take place on 16<sup>th</sup> June with a Music from the 60's, 70's and 80's theme. Encouraged entrants to attend the Carnival Workshops arranged by Eastleigh & Romsey MENCAP. Flyers available for further information.
- Other events leading up to Carnival include: Shop window Treasure Hunt; Quiz Night; West End Walk; Best Allotment and Garden competitions.
- Blue Cross running a Dog Show this year and The Big Noise Community Samba Band are returning to lead the parade.
- Citizen of the Year – Mr Brian Smith. Brian has lived in West End for 30 years – he ran the Bungalow Stores on the corner of Quob Lane and Chapel Road until 1995 and through the years has helped and cared for both old and young. He runs the Thursday Morning Coffee Club in the Parish Centre, is a parishioner of St Brigid's Church and has recently joined West End Bowling club.

**Moorgreen Road Residents Association – Mrs Sarah Turl, Chairman**

- Formed 20 years ago this year – our main focus last year was on the second Bubb Lane Inquiry. Gave thanks for the support from those who spoke at the Inquiry.
- This year our focus will be on traffic in Moorgreen Road and also getting prepared for the Chalcroft development.

**Hilldene Community Association – Nick Thompson**

- Hilldene Community Centre now has around 40 hirers using the centre during the week with a variety of classes including arts and crafts, dog training, table tennis and baby yoga.
- The Committee continue to run fundraising events throughout the year with a well established Skittles Evening and Carnival Stall. An additional event we held this year was an Evening with Two Southampton Footballers from the 1970s, which was well attended.
- We continue to offer the Centre as the venue for refreshments following the annual Remembrance Service in November.
- Gave thanks to staff of West End Parish Council for their support during the past year.

**St James' Lunch Club – Mrs Maureen Cook**

- The Lunch Club was started in November 1984 and is still thriving today. Our aim is to provide a hot meal and companionship for the elderly and lonely residents living within the Parish of West End.
- The Club meet every Monday at 12 noon with lunch served at 12.30pm followed by entertainment. Four times a year we have all day events with tea provided for free.
- Last year's Christmas Party was held for 50+ people with lunch and entertainment by the children of St James' School followed by afternoon tea.
- Availability for several more members, so please contact me if you know of anyone who would like to join.

**West End Local History Society – Nigel Wood**

- A busy year sorting, cataloguing and storing and working on a computerised searchable database which is nearing completion.

- Out of hours visits from local groups by arrangement this year include St Mary's School, Hamble Valley Rotary, One Community, Brendon Care, Hatch Grange WI and a church social group.
- Recently attended Southampton Guildhall at the request of Southampton Choral Society with two local history displays – From Empire to Armageddon and Men Who Marched Away.
- Contacted by Camiila J. Allen from University of Sheffield as she is researching her thesis on Richard St Barbe Baker. She visited the museum and other sites in West End hosted by Peter Sillence.
- 'Westender' the society newsletter goes from strength to strength with each edition eagerly awaited. Gave thanks to all those who contribute articles and the production team.
- Gave thanks to West End Parish Council, Laura Cooke and staff and the groundsmen, as well as HEWEB for all their support.

#### **Brendon Care – Janice Eastlake**

- West End Club has a solid membership of 26 and a team of 4-6 volunteers. The Club meets every Monday afternoon at the Hilldene Centre from 2pm to 4pm.
- Programme of activities is varied including: Rummikub; beetle drives; quizzes; talks; card games; kurling and table top horseracing.
- In February two speakers from the Local History Museum attended and we were invited to visit the museum. 18 members attended and enjoyed the afternoon immensely.
- The Club is a place where everyone is made to feel welcome and is a lifeline for a vulnerable sector of society.
- The age range at the club is from 61 years to 92 years old and in two years we have grown from 8 members to 26.

#### **Friends of West End Copse – Paul Drew**

- The group has carried out 5 Action Mornings during the year and achieved the following: 14 black sacks of litter cleared; cutback of holly and tackling the removal of Cherry Laurel, a non-native species of plant found within the Copse; leaf clearance of paths; removal of a large area of brambles to allow increased light to encourage the growth of native woodland plants; laid 3 tonnes of gravel to improve drainage and restore accessibility to waterlogged paths and installed 6 bat boxes.
- The group has been involved with the following activities: provided feedback to help shape a five year management plan with the expertise of Richard Mould-Ryan – now agreed and adopted by West End Parish Council; supported Friends of Hatch Grange by attending their Work Days; supported West End Carnival with 6 members helping to marshal; organised a visit from Hampshire Butterfly Conservation Trust to aid in increasing numbers by improvement of habitat; laid a wreath to commemorate Remembrance Sunday; held a Christmas Quiz attended by 12 members including 2 Councillors and continued to do adhoc litter picks.
- Asked residents to report any anti-social behaviour to 101.
- Gave thanks to West End Parish Council for providing resources and financial assistance and the Parish groundsmen for their assistance.
- Gave thanks to fellow Committee members and volunteers who give up their time, efforts and skills.

#### **Prop Box Youth Theatre – Caroline Dennis and Sarah Lubbock**

- Prop Box was established in 2016 with the aim of providing young people with a fun, affordable drama group for 6-18 year olds. The group meets Friday evenings at the Hilldene Centre, West End.
- Fees help to cover the basic running costs and we rely solely on fundraising efforts, donation and small grants in order to buy items to enhance the children's performance experience.

- We perform two productions per year with a Winter Panto. We will also be attending the West End Carnival.
- The group would be willing to perform at events held in the community.

#### **The Hannah Chamberlain Foundation – Jim Chamberlain**

- Our aim is to raise funds for the Cancer Research Trust for support 17 to 25 year olds undergoing cancer treatment at Southampton General Hospital.
- We work closely with health professionals and offer grants such as weekends away; car parking fees and even food to young adults.
- We will be holding an event at Haskins Garden Centre on the 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> May to promote and raise the profile of the Foundation.

#### **Life Church West End – Matthew Gwyn**

- The church was launched in September 2017 by members of the West End Christian Fellowship & Life Church.
- Weekly Sunday meetings are held at the Parish Centre from 10.30am to 12 noon with worship, prayer and teaching for all ages.
- Family friendly Harvest Lunch, Christmas Carols, Christmas Eve and Easter Sunday church services are held each year.
- Participated in West End Churches Together Good Friday Walk of Witness handing out ‘real eggs’.

#### **Hedge End Food Centre – Mrs Christine Shelley**

- The Food Centre is based in Kings Community Church, Hedge End and has been operating for almost 5 years. West End Parish Council have supported the food centre with donations on a weekly basis for much of that time.
- Currently serving approximately 20 families a week, upwards of 100 people, depending on the size of the families. We also support individuals.
- Our main sponsor is Marks & Spencer with regular support provided by Co-op, Nationwide Building society, local schools, groups and churches and the WI.
- Due to generous donations we have expanded our support to other charitable organisations, notably: St Luke’s snack project to and from school; Leigh Park Pre-school; The KCC Gems Project; The KCC Halo Project; The Hub Friday Night Project; Fareham & Gosport Refuge; The Gosport Junk Café and Asylum Seekers and Refugees.
- Our team consists of volunteers only. Gave thanks to Kings Community Church for their free accommodation, free electricity and utilities as well as regular donations.
- Mindful of government policies, hence now offering reduced sugar products when available as well as providing some treats.
- Opening times are 10am to 1.30pm Monday and Thursday if anyone would like to visit the Centre.

### **8. REPORT FROM COUNTY AND BOROUGH COUNCILLORS**

**Hampshire County Council (Hedge End North), Eastleigh Borough Council, West End Parish Council – Cllr Bruce Tennant** – apologies received.

**Hampshire County Council (Hedge End South), Eastleigh Borough Council, West End Parish Council – Cllr Tonia Craig**

- **Small Grants:** Supported 16 groups this year. Anyone wanting to apply please contact me.
- **Crime Commissioner Panel:** Council tax to be used for frontline police. Encouraged residents to be patient when dialling 101 – system to be improved.
- Gave thanks to Councillor Turl and Laura Cooke for their support over the past year on a personal issue.

**Hedge End, West End and Botley Local Area Committee – Cllr. Daniel Clarke, Chairman**

- Announced he will be stepping down from his position as Eastleigh Borough Councillor after 8 years in the post.
- We have funded projects at Hildene Community Centre, the Youthouse and St. James' Church. In addition, public toilets have been installed near to the Parish Council and a play area in Mill Gardens is nearly complete.
- The largest project in West End has been at Itchen Valley Country Park and this has involved the redevelopment of the catering provision; a new indoor interactive play area and new outdoor play trail.  
The Country Park has undergone extensive tree work in partnership with the Forestry Commission and the Little Owls kindergarten and Forest School have been outsourced to Youth Options.
- A feasibility study for part of the Midlands Estate was also funded by HEWEB and further funding has been approved to create more car parking spaces.
- Currently 2 public art schemes for the old Moorgreen Hospital site and the approaches to West End are underway and will be delivered later this year. We also have a skate park for Hatch Farm in the pipeline with consultation due to start after May.

**The HEWEB Youth Partnership**

I would like to thank the Committee and Suzanne Watson who has now completed her 2 year stint as Chair. PC Jason Steel has now been elected as the new Chair.

The partnership is a strong group and has worked on the theme of empowering young women this year. The new theme is anti - social behaviour and the Partnership will be discussing how to allocate resources more effectively.

The involvement of young people in the allocation of the HEWEB youth grants is to be commended and Donna Love, the HEWEB Youth Leader manages this process. Her role is jointly funded by the Town Council and HEWEB.

**Across HEWEB**

- We have spent over £10,000 on litter bins; installed 9 flower towers – 3 in each shopping centre; installed over 30 speed limit reminders; agreed 10 traffic regulation orders (dyls) and 2 traffic studies.
- We will again be supporting the Borough Council's Parksport scheme for 8 -16 year olds over the Summer holidays.

**Conclusion**

We will continue to improve the local area in partnership with key organisations such as the parish and town councils in addition to the youth partnership and voluntary groups.

We look forward to receiving local people's views and we welcome participation at the local area committee meetings.

The Chair thanked Councillor Clarke for his contributions in the last 8 years as Borough Councillor.
