Questions from Councillors and Members of the Public

Following questions raised at the February meeting, the Clerk has received the following e-mail response from PS Manns:

- *Theft from person' would not include internet fraud/ crime. This would normally be recorded on Police systems as either 'fraud' (such as 'obtaining services dishonestly' or 'fraud by false representation'), or as 'Action Fraud' which means that partner agencies such as 'Action Fraud' or the 'National Fraud Investigation Bureau' are dealing with it, which they often do for internet type frauds. Examples of 'theft from person' may include pick pocketing (without violence or force as this would fall under 'robbery') right down to a child taking another child's bike. 'Theft from person' would not include thefts from houses (this would be burglary) or shopliftings. It will be a case of one person takes something from another person. This can sometimes border civil territory. For example girlfriend lends boyfriend her iPad. They split up and girlfriend wants the iPad back. At the point the boyfriend decides to 'permanently deprive' the girlfriend of it, it would then become a theft.*
- *Road Traffic 'collisions' are recorded on the same system as all other incidents Police deal with. This is called RMS (Record Management System). We can provide figures for these if required however they do not display an accurate picture. We only record on this system 'injury' road traffic collisions. For example if Police are called to a collision. Two cars are involved and damaged. Both parties are out walking/talking/exchanging details. They both leave the scene by their own means (whether that be driving their vehicle away with minor damage or Police or themselves arranging a recovery truck). Even if they have slight whiplash etc this would not be classed as an 'injury' RTI. Generally it is only classed as an injury RTI if someone is taken off to hospital (as a general rule). This then wouldn't even get created on Police systems (it may stay in the call management system to show it was called in) but it would appear as a 'figure' for statistics purposes. It is only if an injury occurs that we drop it into our full Record Management System' and will add a report/ photographs etc. We would be able to provide you figures of injury collisions in the area if you wish.*

- *I note you ask where 'road traffic incidents' are recorded. If you are referring to collisions then it will be as detailed as above. If you mean all incidents involving cars- eg: cases of Police investigating drink/drug drivers, cases of road rage, cases of anti-social driving matters, then this will again be held on the Record Management System. If Police proactively go out and issue tickets (eg: stand at the roadside with a speed laser, or ticket someone for jumping a red light/ using a mobile phone) then they just issue a ticket at the roadside which is then processed by an admin department. It doesn't get recorded on the 'Record Management System' unless the driver fails to pay the ticket in which case a record is created so we can add a court file and prosecute the matter instead. There probably are stats of how many tickets are issued within the admin departments but this isn't something we can easily access from within our Neighbourhoods Team.*

Councillor Hellier said the reason that he raised the particular points was due to the fact that evidence is needed to back up any incidents. Councillor Turl said she agreed with Councillor Hellier and reiterated that people who bring such issues up at meetings are always asked to record the incident themselves.

- Attended Full Council meeting – agreed to increase Council Tax – will raise £5.7 million.
- Highways England – Smart Motorway works now underway on M27 - will be liaising with Hampshire County Council and Southampton City Council.

Councillor Davis asked how much the Council Tax will be increased by this year?
Councillor Tennent confirmed it would be 6%.

Borough Councillor Reports

Borough Councillor J Asman attended the HEWEB Local Area Committee meeting on 12th March 2018 and reported on the following:

- Public Art Project – to focus on West End Heritage Trail with agreement that the “Welcome to West End” signage will be replaced and a specific piece of art will be located on the old Moorgreen site, now ‘The Pavilions’ to reflect local history. Both projects will be the subject of public consultation.
- Hatch Farm Residents – meeting held with residents to agree an action plan to address some areas of concern. Recommendation to consider a traffic study for Barnsland and adjoining roads, which is currently used as a rat run.
- Itchen Valley Country Park – new play trail equipment to be installed in April as well as interactive indoor play area. Approved planning permission for alterations to the Café and outside covered shelter. IVCP looking for volunteers to clear scrub – details can be found in E News.

Borough Councillor C Boulton – nothing to report.

Borough Councillor D Clarke reported on the following:

- Attended Budget Meeting – EBC has frozen Council Tax.
- Buses – reviewed on a year by year basis. Funds this year to be used to plug the gap on some of the subsidies.
- Chaired HEWEB meeting – points to note:
 - (i) Mill Gardens Play Area – contractor Vita Play has commenced work for a period of 4 weeks. Southern Water claim they have made a contribution to the play area, but no sign of any money as yet.
 - (ii) Poseidon at The Ageas – 17 year old Taylor Bevan won the England Boxing Youth Cadet National Championship title. He is currently undergoing trials for Wales. If selected, he will be Poseidon’s first international boxer.
 - (iii) Silent Soldier – Royal British Legion launched Silent Soldier campaign to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the end of WW1. EBV authorised buying 2 per area – I authorised a third for HEWEB. West End may receive one or two for the Parish.
 - (iv) IVCP Bridle Route – following completion of forestry works, the bridle route has re-opened. As a gesture of goodwill, I approved freezing the charges for use of the bridle route for 2018/19 due to the closure.

- (v) Following grants awarded: £4000 to local youth grants; £22,000 to Midlands Estate; £116,100 to Wildern swimming pool roof; £168,134 to the skate park at Hatch Farm.

Borough Councillor B Tennent reported on the following:

- Land at Horton Heath - £142 million has now been spent on land in this area.
- Local problem with rats at the Moorgreen Road allotment site. Established the ditch is the responsibility of the Parish Council.
- St James School – EBC civil engineers currently working on access at front of school. New School Governor – Richard Gomer.
