I'm sending this Neighbourhood News out to you all, the evening before the 'Beast From The East' is upon us! Please all take care out there and make the time, to prepare for what we know is coming -

- We recommend you don't drive, unless absolutely necessary!
- Make sure you have warm clothing, blankets, food and drink in your vehicle.
- Drive with extra care, even if the roads have been treated.
- Keep well back from the road user in front, as **stopping distances can be ten times** greater than on dry roads.
- Be prepared for the road conditions to change, over relatively short distances.

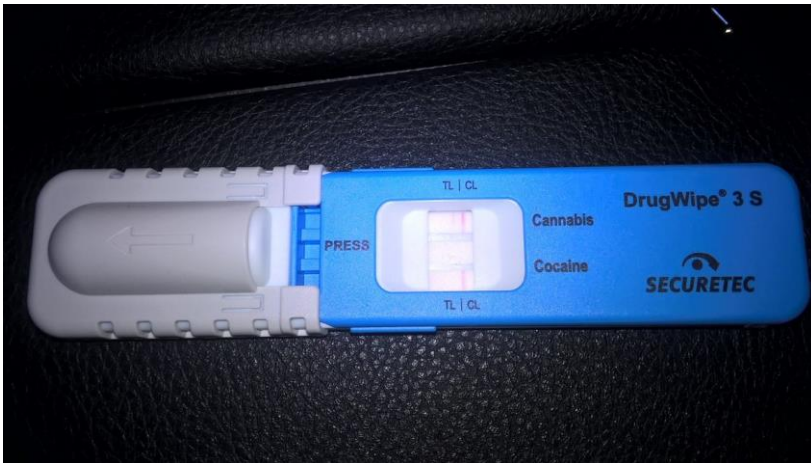

If you should need to make a report of an issue / incident, please ensure you call 101. Or if you wish to report either, **criminal damage, theft or theft from a vehicle** you can do this online [here](#) **Please do not report incidents by replying to this alert or emailing an officer direct** - we cannot take reports this way. An officer may be committed, on leave, or off sick and the message will sit in their inbox and no one else would be aware of it. It is important to ensure the call taker is aware you want to **make a report of the incident - not that you wish to pass a message to us**. They can then create the report, so that the incident is available for every department, officer and staff to see. A decision will then be made as to whether an officer needs to be deployed and whether this needs to be urgently or not.
