005/23/REC CAFÉ / PICNIC AREA DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

A revised quotation and plan has been received from VitaPlay at £165,000 +VAT. Councillors discussed that the quotation needs to come down to around £130,000 to keep it within the budget.

The Deputy Clerk had a meeting with a second company Kompan. They will be submitting a quotation in the coming weeks. They use sustainable and recycled materials to manufacturer their equipment. The Deputy Clerk commented that they were very positive about what they can offer to develop the area within the budget given.

A site visit has been arranged with Wicksteed for a third quote.

Councillors agreed to wait until all three quotes had been received to discuss this further.

- Shawyers are in the process of confirming their quote to install the new path. The benches are still to be installed. It has been too wet to this before now.
- The first meeting of the new Public Art Hatch Farm Steering Group took place on Thursday 23rd March where the aims and objectives for the project were set out. The next meeting will be taking place on Monday 24th April to discuss the artist brief.

Cllr Weeks expressed a wish to join this meeting, however, the Deputy Clerk explained that the leader of the Steering Group wanted the initial discussions to be kept small but will look to open this up to more participants once the initial stages are complete.


