Community Speed Watch is not enforcement, it is education.

Community Speed Watch is used throughout Hampshire and the Isle of Wight in circumstances that are necessary, reasonable and proportionate to:

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

Speeding is one of the factors that most affects the quality of life in communities around Hampshire and the Isle of Wight. It can be a factor in road traffic collisions and impacts on the day-to-day lives of people in the local community.


What is Community Speed Watch?

Community Speed Watch is a scheme that enables members of the public to volunteer alongside Hampshire and Isle of Wight Constabulary to monitor the speed of traffic passing through their area and identify vehicles which exceed the speed limit. Each scheme is run by the volunteers and managed and supported by their local Neighbourhood Policing Team.

How does it work?

Volunteers use equipment that can monitor the speed of passing traffic. The volunteers manually collect details at the roadside of speeding vehicles and pass this onto Hampshire and Isle of Wight Police. Vehicle checks are undertaken by the police and entered onto a database. The registered keeper of the vehicle will then be sent an educational letter telling them that their vehicle was seen exceeding the speed limit and the impact their actions have on the local Community. If the same registration number is logged again within 2 years, the registered vehicle keeper will receive a warning that if the vehicle is seen a third time the details will be passed to an officer who may take further action.

- Improving the quality of life for local communities by increasing their confidence and satisfaction in the way speeding issues are dealt with.
- * Reduce the speed of vehicles to the speed limit
- Increase public awareness of inappropriate speed
- Reduce death and injury on roads
- Empower local people to take action on local issues



Itchen Valley Country Park

Itchen Valley Country Park is set in 440 acres of beautiful water meadows, woodland and meadows situated beside the River Itchen and has been recognised with ten Green Flag Awards. The park is currently undergoing a major £3.3 million transformation with a range of exciting improvements. Itchen Valley Country Park plays an important role in the wellbeing of local people, as well as visitors from further afield. The planned works will bring exciting new elements that will make it more versatile for a range of events and activities, while preserving it as a valued local amenity, where Borough residents can enjoy its tranquil surroundings.

Exciting New Features

The project will bring exciting new features to the country park, including:

- a new community building at High Hill Field
- remodelling of Highwood Barn and Kingfisher Barn
- better barbecue and picnic areas
- upgraded play equipment
- a new central events and welcoming space at Highwood Barn
- a covered outdoor seating area for customers to the popular Woodland Café



Greater Accessibility

The improved facilities will also provide greater accessibility, with a Changing Places room for disabled users, as well as additional toilets. Car parking will be upgraded and the riverside access road will be diverted to keep vehicles away from park users.

Architects and master planners for the built elements of the scheme are RH Partnership Architects (rhp) who also created the award-winning Lakeside Centre at Lakeside Country Park in central Eastleigh, which is also Council-owned. rhp aim to create stimulating places for people to enjoy, live and work in, schemes that also benefit the wider community, using energy and natural resources in a considered, environment-friendly way.

Utilita Bowl Strives To Become The World's Greenest Cricket Ground

The South Coast's premier international cricket, music, and leisure venue has been renamed Utilita Bowl as part of a ground-breaking multi-year deal with local Hampshire company Utilita Energy.



The venue, also home to a Hilton hotel, eforea Spa, and BEEFY'S by Lord Botham, is striving to become the greenest cricket ground in the world through installing over 1,000 solar panels on the roof of the stadium.

CEO at Utilita Bowl, David Mann, said "We're delighted to partner with Utilita, a Hampshire-based business, who share our values and can now help share our vision of creating the greenest international cricket venue in the world."

The money saved from the solar array will see every match at

carbon per year – the equivalent of driving over 300,000 miles in the average car or driving the length of the UK 360 times.

The panels will also be capable of generating around 25% of the electricity used in the stadium each year.

"The cheapest and greenest energy is the energy we don't use," s+65aid Bill Bullen, CEO at Utilita.

2nd West End Brownies	The cost of living crisis has seen some of our brownies unable to purchase the uniform required to attend. This grant would be used to fund hardship donations in the form of uniform for those Brownies that need it the most.	£300

Friends of West End Copse	Currently about 20 steps in the Copse are in a poor state of repair, insecure and in need of replacement. If replaced with a composite product they should last up to 20 years and improve safety for users. Cost per composite step is £24.	£300	
Harefield Primary School	We are looking to enhance the experiences we provide our children. We are able to offer lots of in school experiences such as visits from outside organisations etc but truly nothing beats the experience of a school trip. I am sure you will agree, going out on a school trip was an exciting part of your school journey. Our parents and children are desperate to experience the thrill of a trip. However, the cost of these trips can be extortionate and often result in being cancelled due to lack of payment from parents and carers. Any grant would go towards a trip fund for our children. We are in the process of planning a school trip for every year group. Our new head has made it her mission that every child will have been on a school visit by the end of the year. The money given to us will help to significantly reduce the amount we charge our parents.	£300	
Hatch Grange WI	We would like to purchase, 2 Kurling Targets, Storage Boxes, Lanyards for members and committee, Speakers for meetings.	£300	
Hilldene Community Association	The grant would be used to part fund replacement soft seating in the entrance foyer.	£300	
Propbox Youth Theatre	We wish to purchase a green screen and lights for our film making class to give our youngsters the opportunity to learn new skills.	£300	
Speedwatch	Across the police sector we carry out up to 12 sessions per month. Cheesecake Filled Easter Eggs

What You'll Need:

- 1 Hollow Chocolate Easter Egg
- 75g Digestive Biscuits
- 25g Butter, melted
- 75g Mascarpone
- 100g Soft Cheese
- 2 tbsp Icing Sugar, sieved
- 2 tbsp Cocoa Powder, sieved
- 100g Double Cream


To Serve— Mini chocolate eggs, crumbled chocolates, caramel sauce or cooled chocolate

Carefully separate the Easter egg in half along the seam. (Use a knife dipped into a bowl of hot water to cut through the seam).

Tip the digestive biscuits into a bowl or food bag and bash to crumbs with the end of a rolling pin. Stir in the melted butter until the mixture resembles damp sand. Spoon this into the Easter egg halves and pack down gently using the back of the spoon. Chill until needed.

Mix the mascarpone, soft cheese, icing sugar and cocoa together in a medium bowl with a wooden spoon until smooth. In a separate bowl, beat the double cream to soft peaks using an electric whisk. Gently fold the whipped cream into the mascarpone mixture, then carefully spoon the cheesecake filling over the chilled biscuit bases in the Easter eggs. Gently level the surfaces with a palette knife or spatula, then chill for at least 2 hrs or overnight until firm and set.

Scatter the set cheesecake-filled eggs with mini chocolate eggs or other Easter treats, then drizzle with caramel or melted chocolate to serve.

What You'll Need:


- 225g Dark Chocolate, broken into pieces
- 2tbsp Golden Syrup
- 50g Butter
- 75g Cornflakes

Line a 12-hole cake tin with paper cases.

Melt the chocolate, golden syrup, and butter in a bowl set over a saucepan of gently simmering water (do not let the base of the bowl touch the water). Stir the mixture until smooth.

Remove the bowl from the heat and gently stir in the cornflakes until all of the cereal is coated in the chocolate.

Divide the mixture between the paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set.

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

Some really helpful information put together by Eastleigh Borough Council on how you can do your bit to help cut waste.

Reduce

Don't Waste Food

Food makes up a substantial amount of what we throw away, but it doesn't have to. Planning meals, sticking to a shopping list, freezing leftovers and going by use by dates (rather than best before) are all sensible ways to cut back on food waste. Love food, hate waste has some tasty recipes to make better use of leftovers, while apps like TooGoodToGo and Olio help stop food from retailers and neighbours from going to waste. Remember you can compost and recycle your peelings and other unavoidable food waste.

Avoid Single Use Plastics

There's been lots in the media recently about the damage single use plastics do to our environment, and rightfully so. There are lots of ways we can avoid

- carry a 'bag for life'
- take a drink bottle or coffee cup out with you
- say no to plastic straws and coffee stirrers
- use compostable bamboo toothbrushes, instead of plastic ones
- use bars of soap, shampoo and conditioner, rather than bottles
- give children wooden colouring pencils instead of plastic felt-tip pens

Recycle

Use Our Collections

Through your green recycling bin collection, you can recycle paper, cardboard, food tins, drink cans, empty aerosol cans and plastic bottles fortnightly. On the same day, you can recycle glass and used batteries using your black box collection. Every week you can recycle food waste through your brown bin collection to turn it into clean energy. You can also subscribe to our fortnightly garden waste recycling collections.

Use a Recycling Bank or Centre

recycling banks in your area on the Recycle Now website. Hampshire County Council's Smart Living lists reuse and repair sites. Some supermarkets and local Co-op stores allow you to recycle 'soft plastics'. Finally, you can take waste and recycling to one of the four Household waste and recycling centres.

Be food thrifty

Swap out single use

Single use items are very wasteful as they are made to be used once, then thrown away. Luckily there are many reusable alternatives.

- 12. Carry a 'bag for life'
- 13. Take a drink bottle or coffee cup out
- 14. Say no to plastic straws and stirrers
- 15. Use bars of soap, shampoo and conditioner, rather than bottles
- 16. Give children wooden colouring pencils instead of plastic felt-tip pens
- 17. Use wax wraps rather than cling film
- 18. Take your own containers along to a local refill station, like the Spinnery 53 or the Hampshire Refillery
- 19. Use reusable nappies and wet wipes instead of disposable ones
- 20. Dine in rather than take away
- 21. Use steel rather than disposable cutlery

Reuse

Simple Swaps

Many single use items have reusable alternatives. Using these simple swaps will save you a trip to the shop, and the waste bin! You could swap:

- cling film for reusable wax wraps
- plastic cutlery for steel cutlery
- single use batteries for rechargeable ones
- disposable nappies and wet wipes for reusable ones

Buy Second-hand

Buying 'preloved' furniture, clothing and other items from charity shops, instead of new items, can reduce environmental costs that come from the manufacturing process and support a good cause at the same time. There are also plenty of apps and websites dedicated to the buying selling and giving away of second-hand goods.

Make a Single Use, a Double Use

Before throwing something out, think about whether it could have a second use. Here are a practical ideas:

- jam jars to store screws and other small items
- bread bags as nappy bin liners
- toothbrushes for cleaning in between tiles
- junk mail as scrap paper
- using butter wrappers to grease a baking tray
- yoghurt pots as seedling pots

- 43. Recycle unavoidable food waste (e.g. peelings) in your brown bin

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

Paper

Most paper can be recycled, please remove plastic wrapping.

The following won't be accepted:

Shredded paper, tissues and kitchen roll, metallic wrapping paper, wallpaper, paper towels, glittery greetings cards and if paper is stained/dirty with food, grease, paint etc.

Cardboard

Cardboard can be placed in your bin. Tear and fold it down to fit more in. If on occasion you have more cardboard than you can fit in the bin, fold it up neatly and place next to your recycling bin. Large amounts of cardboard should be taken to the household waste recycling centre.

The following won't be accepted:

Greasy card such as take away pizza boxes, fast food packaging.

Food Tins and Drink Cans

Please empty and clean your food tins and cans before recycling. Sweet and biscuit selection tins are also accepted.

The following won't be accepted:

Tin foil packaging - this can be recycled at your local Household Recycling Centre.

Plastic Bottles

Any bottle shaped plastic can be recycled. Lids (but not pump or spray tops) and labels can be left on. Please empty any liquid content and squash the bottle before replacing the lid. Don't forget your cleaning, hair product and cosmetic bottles.

The following won't be accepted:

Any non-bottle plastic, such as margarine tubs or plastic packaging trays e.g. fruit trays and meat trays.

Empty Aerosol Cans

Please ensure your aerosol cans are empty before recycling.

The following won't be accepted:

Full aerosols and tin foil packaging





Here is a list of some of the regular items placed in the green recycling bins that **CANNOT** be recycled

If these items appear in your green recycling bin, then the bin may not be collected.

- Tissue paper and kitchen roll
- * Tin foil
- Plastic trays e.g. meat and fruit trays
- * Greasy card e.g. fast food boxes, take away pizza boxes
- * Yoghurt pots
- * Takeaway coffee cups
- * Plastic tubs e.g. margarine or ice cream tubs
- Sweets and crisp wrappers
- * Tetra paks e.g. juice cartons
- Plastic bags do not bag your recycling
- Christmas wrapping paper and paper with paint, glitter or glue on it
